## Whitehall must give the world's poor all the money it promised

SIR – This time last year more than 300 religious, associates and third order members took part in a lobby of Parliament ahead of the June 8 Hunger Summit where we were proud that the UK Government pledged £655 million for combating deadly childhood malnutrition.

Since then the UK has only announced how it is going to spend less than five per cent of its new funding.

This week (June 8) is the anniversary of Nutrition for Growth and as a Daughter of the Cross committed to the world's poor, I would ask our Government to give a full update on where and when it will be spending its pledged funds from Nutrition for Growth.

Globally, undernutrition is responsible for 45 per cent of all deaths in children under five; and more than

165 million children have stunted growth due to poor nutrition. If we are to defeat this terrible condition it is crucial that the UK Government makes further announcements on how it will disburse the funds.
